We always return from these visits with great enthusiasm: The quality, reliability and commitment of our colleagues seeks it peers in the current medical industry. ANTIBIOTICS IN GP PRACTICES

Among other things, the RAI study on the use of antibiotics showed that 70 percent of the GPs surveyed also consider their own prescribing behavior to be the reason of the increase in resistance. Almost everyone knows the option of "tightened prescriptions", but only 30 percent do so (Salm et al., BMC Infectious Diseases, 2018).

INFECTIOUS DISEASE IN SHARED ACCOMODATIONS

Notifiable infectious diseases among refugees are not well known yet. In a survey involving over 15,000 refugees in a primary reception center in Munich, we showed that vaccination soon after arrival as well as hygiene measures may reduce the number of cases of illness in shared accommodations (Alberer et al., Infection, 2018).

FROM INTENSIVE CARE UNIT TO GP

After critical illness and treatment on an intensive care unit, some patients have an increased need for medical care. In our residency program "Hausarzt 360°", we investigate this need in cooperation with research partners from Greifswald and Augsburg using data from the population study SHIP (Study of Health in Pomerania).

GUIDELINES IN GP PRACTICES

Clinical guidelines are no principles, but "aids for good medicine", states our specialist society (DEGAM). How can their application and implementation be supported in GP practices? The systematic review shows: Of 36 studies and their measures, 27 had no effect, 14 a moderate and 21 a strong effect on transfer of knowledge, diagnostic behavior, prescribing and counseling, and on patient-level outcomes. Individual measures were more effective than the simultaneous combination of several measures (Kovacs et al. JGIM 2018). jochen.gensichen@med.uni-muenchen.de
