The International Tennis Hall of Fame in Newport, Rhode Island, is where tennis legends are celebrated and tennis history comes alive. This special place has an impressive museum which includes remarkable treasures from the past 140 years!

The Story of the Newport Casino

Did you know the Newport Casino isn't for gambling? "Casino" just means a place where people gather to have fun! In 1880, newspaper publisher James Gordon Bennett Jr. built this beautiful place for tennis and other activities. In 1881, the very first U.S. National Tennis Championships (now called the US Open) was played right here with 25 players competing while a string quartet played music!

How the International Tennis Hall of Fame Was Born

In 1954, tennis champion Jimmy Van Alen (who also invented the tiebreak!) saved the Newport Casino by turning it into the International Tennis Hall of Fame. He wanted a special place to honor tennis heroes forever. At first, it was just for American players, but in 1975, it became the International Tennis Hall of Fame. Today, this National Historic Landmark continues to celebrate tennis stars from all over the world!



What Makes a Hall of Famer

Want to be in the International Tennis Hall of Fame someday? Here's what you need to accomplish:

- Be one of the best players in the world and win major tournaments
- Show great sportsmanship and help make tennis better
- Be retired from professional tennis for at least five years
- Get nominated and selected by tennis experts

As of 2026, 272 amazing individuals from 28 countries have become Hall of Famers! Some families even have multiple members in the Hall of Fame, including brothers, and even a mother and daughter!
